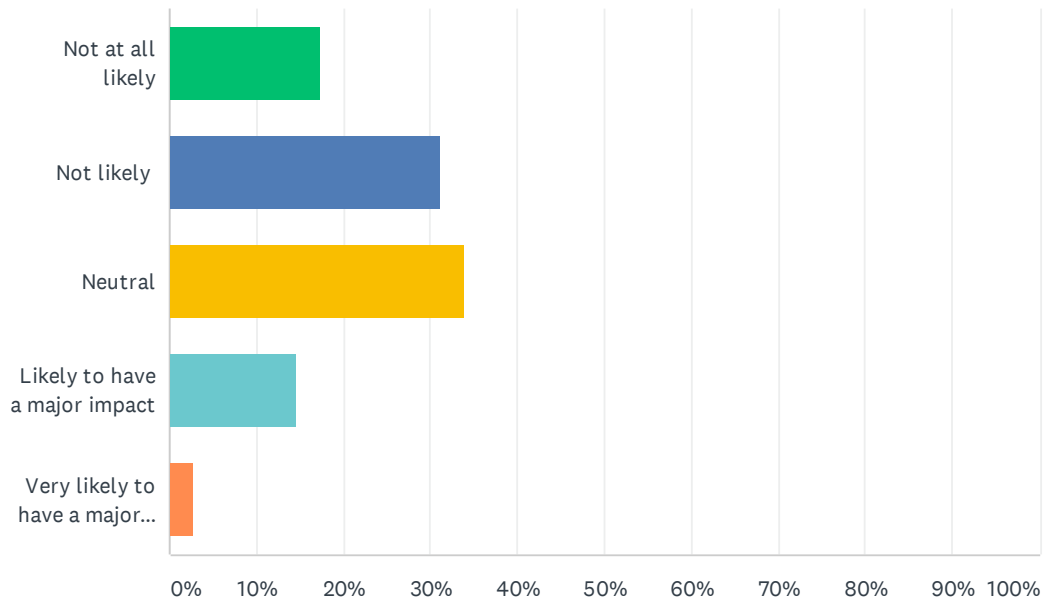


Q1 How likely do you think that the coronavirus will have a major impact on the sustainability of your civic society?
